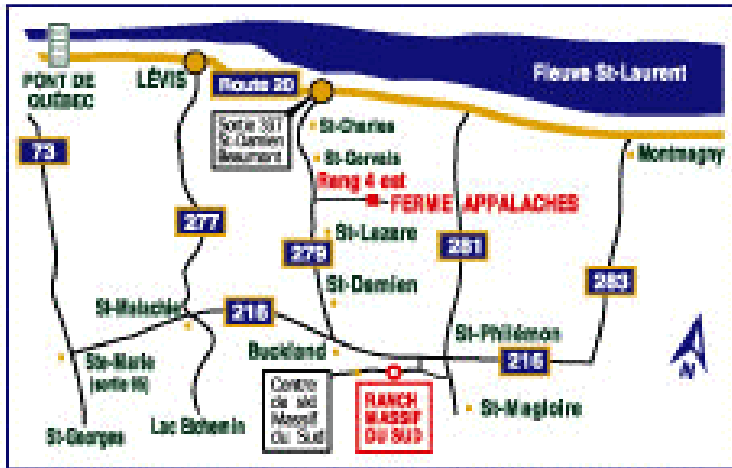

## How to get there:

Just over an hour's drive from Québec City: Take Hwy 20 East; Take Exit 337 and follow Route 279 south to Buckland. Turn left (east) on Route 216 and then right on Route du Massif du Sud, toward the ski resort, between the villages of Buckland and St-Philémon. The Ranch will be on your right about 1 km before the ski resort.



## Situation:

*The Massif du Sud is threatened by two industrial wind energy projects totalling 175 MW of installed capacity, with one hundred wind turbines to invade our regional park. The people engaged in a struggle in many areas to protect their territory from industrial wind energy have planned a major gathering at the Ranch du Massif du Sud on June 21, 2010. They proudly take a stand to denounce the democratic vacuum that currently exists in our communities, which excludes citizens from the process of making decisions that affect them profoundly; decisions affecting their territory.*

\*Leave the Ranch at 10:15      Proceed on foot, on horseback, on buggy, to gather in front of the administrative offices of the Massif du Sud regional park, to be seen and heard, with drums and percussion, to denounce the incompatibility of industrial wind energy with our regional park.

Speeches : 10:30 to 11:30      Speeches by participants supporting the actions of the Ranch, representing various groups including the Métis and the citizens affected by wind energy and mining operations
